

Documentary edit:

This style film is linear in format. Beginning with the preparations and continuing through with photos, the ceremony, post ceremony photos, cocktail hour, shots of room details, grand entry, dances, toasts, cake bouquet toss, etc.

Preparations, photos, cocktail hour and room details are edited to music with sound bites during preparations.

The ceremony, dances, toasts, cake and bouquet toss are edited and presented in their entirety with the ambient sound.

This type of edit is typically an hour or more depending upon the length of the ceremony and toasts.

Feature Film (Short Form edit):

This style film employs the use of time-shifting. Each film is different, but might begin with a snippet of the vows or a toast, then shift back to the preparations. The film moves creatively in this way through all events. Only key parts of the ceremony and toasts are used. Background music is used throughout in addition to lots of sound bites, which drive the story.

This type of film ranges from 10 minutes to 25 minutes.

*So as not to miss out on anything, the short form edit includes a *full copy of the ceremony, first dance and toasts.*

Highlight Film:

The highlight film is a short film (3-5 minutes), which encapsulates the day. It is usually set to one song with storytelling sound bites. Lots of examples of these are on our website. These are a fun way to share with friends and family without overloading them!

Choosing Music:

We are happy to work with you on music. For *documentary edit* clients, we need music for preparations, photos, and cocktail hour. *Short form edits* use music throughout (more instrumentals)

Highlight films require one song. (Included)

Any music used online must be licensed.

We use www.songfreedom.com or www.themusicbed.com for licensing songs.

Delivery:**Mediazilla:**

For full HD delivery we can post your entire film on Mediazilla with chapters just as you would navigate on a DVD. The film can be downloaded to your computer as well. Mediazilla is free to the client (you must sign up however) and will remain online indefinitely. (even if Classic Filmworks were to cancel their account) A good way to archive.
